Request for quote for Video Services – Stakeholder Forum 11-12 Nov 2026

Introduction

The National Biodiversity Data Centre was established as a company limited by guarantee in December 2022, following a decision of Government to put the initiative on a more secure footing, to empower and better resource the Centre to support Ireland's collective national effort to reverse biodiversity loss and contribute to nature restoration. The primary role of the Centre is to contribute to building the knowledge base on biodiversity and track how it is changing in Ireland. It works to ensure that data and information on Ireland's biodiversity is more freely available and accessible for use in research, conservation management and decision-making. A priority of the Centre is to ensure that data and information is easily accessible for local communities and individuals to promote a better understanding and appreciation of biodiversity at the local level.

Requirements

The National Biodiversity Data Centre (NBDC) is seeking quotations from a suitably experienced company to provide video services at this two-day Stakeholder Forum, taking place on 11 and 12 November 2026 at the Ashling Hotel, Dublin.

The Forum will comprise approximately 20 presentations (20-30min) and a number of participatory sessions. AV services are covered in a separate "RFQ for AV Services – Stakeholder Forum 11-12 Nov 2026"

The required services will include:

1. Pre-event planning and preparation

- a. Attend a number of planning meetings with NBDC staff in advance of Forum
- b. Liaise with AV technicians in advance of Forum to confirm and plan audio and visual/lighting requirements/specifications.

2. Filming presentations – 2 days

- a. Filming of each talk with a single camera.
- b. Filming of talks with a second camera for wide/CU angle

3. Filming of 5 x 3 minute interviews/vox-pops (single camera)

- a. Filming with keynote speakers/key staff

4. Editing

- a. Editing of 20 presentations, to include Powerpoint slides where required, and delivery of video files (for upload to NBDC's Vimeo/Youtube/website) by 23/11/26.
- b. Editing of interview/vox-pop videos including revisions where required, to be delivered by 30/11/26

Proposal

Submissions should contain the following:

1. The overall cost. All prices should be stated excluding VAT with the rate of VAT payable (where applicable) clearly stated separately. All prices quoted should be fully inclusive of any travel, subsistence, or other costs necessary to effectively discharge the role.

Breakdown of costs to include:

- a. Planning, including technical/AV meetings in advance of Forum
- b. Filming and editing of 20 x 20-30min presentations (2 camera)
- c. Filming and editing of 5 x interviews/vox-pops

2. Experience providing video services for similar events
